The collection of the CAFOD Pyramid boxes is **this weekend 29<sup>th</sup> - 30<sup>th</sup> April**.

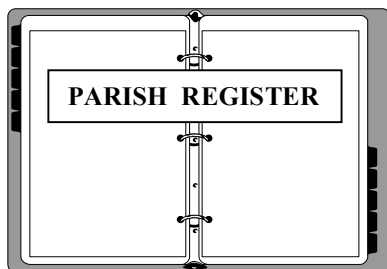
**SVP MEETING** – The next meeting of the SVP will be on **Tuesday 2<sup>nd</sup> May** in **St. Joseph's Hall**.

#### **WORLD DAY OF PRAYER FOR VOCATIONS**

**7<sup>TH</sup> MAY GOOD SHEPHERD SUNDAY (4<sup>th</sup> Sunday Easter)**, It is a **Day of Prayer for Vocations to the Priesthood and Consecrated Life**. *'Behind every vocation ... there is always (the) prayer of someone'* (Pope Francis). Vocations are out there in our own diocese. We have seen the **fruits of our prayers** as we now have **four students** in Seminary and **another one due to begin** his studies in September. Another of our seminarians, **Daniel Stanton**, has completed his six years of studies this year and is **due to be ordained priest** on **Saturday 22<sup>nd</sup> July 2017**. Please keep him in your prayers. But **we need to pray for more** young men to come forward. There will be a **SECOND COLLECTION NEXT WEEKEND** for the Priests' Training Fund (PTF). It takes £20,000 to train a student per year (over six years). PLEASE NOTE THIS IS AN URGENT APPEAL AS THE PRIESTS' TRAINING FUND NEEDS TO BE TOPPED UP EACH YEAR TO MEET THE COSTS. **TOILETRIES FOR ASYLUM SEEKERS – NEXT COLLECTION WEEKEND 13<sup>th</sup>-14<sup>th</sup> May (5<sup>th</sup> Sunday Easter).** Sister Ruth O'Neill of the Sisters of Charity, based in Ely, who works with a drop-in centre for **destitute asylum seekers** located in Trinity Church on Newport Road, will be with us that weekend and she will speak at all Masses about her work with Space4u and Home4u. You are asked to donate **mostly toiletries for men**, particularly: soap, shower gel, shampoo, deodorant, toothbrushes, toothpaste, razors, toilet rolls and washing powder tablets. Please note that the toiletries drop is on **that weekend only**.

**NATIONAL PILGRIM VIRGIN STATUE OF OUR LADY OF FATIMA –** This is the **Centenary year of the Fatima apparitions**, and the World Apostolate of Fatima (WAF) England and Wales National Pilgrim Virgin **statue and relics** of Blessed Jacinta and Francisco Marto will be **visiting** numerous Cathedrals and churches this summer, including **St. David's Cathedral in Cardiff from 6<sup>th</sup> – 7<sup>th</sup> May 2017**. ### WELSH NATIONAL SHRINE – CARDIGAN

A beautiful **statue of Our Lady** was said to have appeared on the banks of the river Teifi and it became a **place of pilgrimage**. In the 20<sup>th</sup> Century. Monks from Brittany gave their Abbey the name of **Our Lady of Cardigan** and revived the devotion. They left in 1916. In 1952 a new statue was commissioned and was placed in a **new shrine** which was dedicated as the National Shrine of Wales by Pope John Paul II in 1986. During Pope Benedict's visit in 2010, the statue was blessed at Westminster Cathedral. Visitors from near and far have come to pray at the statue. This year the Welsh National **Pilgrimage** to Cardigan led by Archbishop George Stack will take place on **21<sup>st</sup> May**. We hope that some members of our parish will be able to attend. The Sacrament of Reconciliation is an important element of the Pilgrimage and all are welcome to attend. **SEE POSTER.**
