## Assisted Suicide Bill (Marris Bill). Action!

We are reminded that this very important debate is taking place in the House of Commons on the 11th September to legalise assisted suicide. Archbishop Peter Smith, Chairman of the Bishops' Conference Dept for Christian Responsibility and Citizenship, tells us that there are many MPs who are paying close attention to the views of their constituents and we must let our voices be heard. This weekend 29th/30th August there will be postcards available pointing out the great risks in the Bill and these cards can be signed and sent to our two MPs.

The postcards will be handed out as you leave the church and you can either sign them there and then and leave them in the box provided, or else you can take them home with you and **post** them yourself to your MP at the House of Commons. There is an urgency here because of the lack of time, so please act now. Thank you!

Pope Francis has spoken out about the sanctity of human life: In a special message to Catholics, Pope Francis has emphasised the need to care for life from conception to natural end. He says that all life has inestimable value - 'even the weakest and most vulnerable; the sick, the old, the unborn and the poor, are masterpieces of God's creation; made in his own image.....and deserving of the utmost reverence and respect ..."

We are to build "an environment of compassion and care, that nurtures and sustains life, even in the most challenging of human events and personal circumstances".

### **Annual Holiday – Canon Joe**

Please note that from Tuesday 1st September until Thursday 17th September Canon Joe will be away from the parish on his annual holiday. Fr. Dermot Tredget OSB will cover the weekend Masses. There will be Eucharistic Services each weekday (Mon to Fri) during this period.
