#### MGR. JOE. A REFLECTION ON THE WEEK.

It was a sobering statistic that filtered down through the media during the week and which made us all catch our breath and pause for thought and prayer. Over 100,000 people have died from Covid-19 in the UK since March last year and the figures are still riding high and may even get worse before they begin to get better.

There were heart-rending reports from the families of those who have lost loved ones and harrowing accounts from NHS front-line workers who carry on despite being overwhelmed, over-worked and under-staffed. Their tenacity and resilience and courage is nothing short of heroic.

However, we are hopeful that the vaccines currently being rolled-out will give us some protection from the transmission of the virus and that we will see a gradual turnaround of the pandemic so that our lives and livelihoods can return to some semblance of normality in the weeks and months ahead.

## PRAYER MUST PLAY AN IMPORTANT PART.

Jesus says "Do not lose faith in me. I am with you always." We often pray and ask the Lord to "deliver us from every evil", and at the moment those prayers take on a particular poignancy.

We must therefore keep on asking the Lord to deliver us from this global pestilence, and while we pray for those who have died and mourn with the bereaved, let us also thank the Lord for the progress made in developing the vaccines, which we hope will eventually deliver us from this "evil." Jesus said "I have come that you may have life, and have it to the full". Coronavirus denies so many people that "fullness of life" which they were meant to enjoy, and also frustrates God's loving and fatherly care for them.

### THE MOST RECENT LOCKDOWN.

There has been a 3-week extension to the present Lockdown until 19th Feb. Although the statistics have shown a levelling-off of the rate of transmission of the virus recently, the impact of the new variants still poses a threat which needs to be monitored for a further period. Masses will therefore continue to be streamed without a congregation.

### ST MARY'S CHURCH - FLOOD DAMAGE.

Work will begin this coming week on phase one of the work to address the damage to the church caused by the flooding. Only when the drying -out process is completed can the main restoration work begin. This is estimated to be at the beginning of April with the work finishing by the end of May.

## **WORLD LEPROSY DAY (31<sup>ST</sup> January 2021)**

The John Bradburne Memorial Society (JBMS) was set up in honour of John Bradburne (known as God's Vagabond) who sacrificed his life for the hundreds of leprosy patients who lived with bags over their heads and numbers around their necks at Mutemwa in Zimbabwe. There are still a growing number of leprosy patients at our care centre and, sadly, leprosy is on the increase in Zimbabwe. We want to raise awareness of this forgotten disease, where there are still 7 million people living with leprosy worldwide, despite the disease being completely curable if treated in the early stages. Due to the misunderstanding and lack of information of leprosy, people affected by the disease can be left marginalised, excluded from their communities and experience prejudice.
